In 2022 we celebrated our 178th birthday which was a wonderful opportunity to reflect on our work over the years. For generations we have acted as a mirror to our communities; creating innovative programmes to tackle the needs of society at the time.

YMCA is a global movement and it all started in 1844 with us - Central YMCA.

Since our creation, we have served our community with bespoke programmes and services, in response to their needs. It's why we're well placed to tackle the social challenges our communities face, now and in the future.



1844 - Central YMCA

Founded: George Williams, a young Somerset apprentice, and a group of fellow drapers create what has now become the global YMCA movement.



1881 - First YMCA

gym: We opened our first gym, and physical as well as mental fitness became central to our mission.



1849 - Non-Christians welcomed: Not long after we were founded we opened our doors to non-Christians - a pioneering move at the time. We are proud to uphold thisv legacy with policy of inclusivity across all areas of society.

1997 - Positive Health:

The Positive Health programme was set up as part of Central YMCA's ongoing response to the HIV crisis of the 80s and 90s, growing to become the leading exercise referral programme for those living with HIV.

1984 - YMCAfit: We created YMCAfit to deliver the first Exercise to Music course. Since then, we have trained over 120,000 instructors, and almost every gym in the country has YMCA trained and qualified staff.



1998 - YMCA Awards:



Launch of YMCA Awards, our awarding organisation which designs health, fitness and wellbeing qualifications and resources. These are seen as the gold standard across the globe, helping people to fulfil their ambitions and progress in their careers.

2010 - InstructAbility:

Central YMCA and Aspire launch InstructAbility, providing free fitness industry training and support for disabled people.



1914 - World War I: YMCA went to war with the soldiers in WW1, providing food, supplies and even paper for over 20 million letters home. The graves of the 40,000 YMCA volunteers who died during WW1 were granted recognition by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission, and many received military and civilian honours. After the war, YMCA helped to find jobs for 38,000 ex-servicemen.



1911 - First Multi-purpose home:

We opened our first purpose-built home on Great Russell Street. It included halls for meetings, restaurants, a gym, swimming baths, social rooms, a boys department and 240 bedrooms.



1977 - YMCA Training: As a response to the recession of the 1970s, YMCA Training was born. As young people faced mass unemployment, our new non-profit program helped disadvantaged young people find new opportunities for work through training and apprenticeships.

1939 - World War II: YMCA followed armies during WW2, with mobile huts providing mugs of tea, cigarettes, chocolate, cake, hair cream, toothpaste and stationery to the troops. They cared for the wounded, supported servicemen at home and abroad, and trained prisoners of war and refugees. During the retreat at Dunkirk, YMCA auxiliaries remained on the beaches until ordered to withdraw.

2013 - Merged with YMCA

Training: YMCA Training and Central YMCA officially merge, creating an education-focused national charity that can reach more than 60,000 people across the UK every year.

2015 - YMCA KX: We opened YMCA KX, a yoga and pilates studio near Kings Cross.



2018 - Fitness Training Academy: We launched the Fitness Training Academy, a free 2 year Personal Training programme aimed at making the fitness industry more accessible to young people.

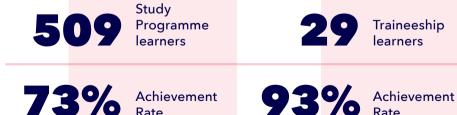
With a focus on equity and progression, our education pathways provide a variety of ways to shape the next generation, from Study Programmes to Traineeships.

As an alternative to traditional routes, such as college or A-Levels, Central YMCA educational provision is often the first choice for learners—supporting pre-16 and 16-19-year-olds to develop skills and gain the necessary qualifications to secure a lasting career.

In 2021/22,15 learners applied to higher education and all learners received a conditional/unconditional offer. From 15 offers, 14 of those were accepted. This number exceeds previous figures and has helped to show future learners that going to university is a possibility.

Making an impact across our communities and the country

Almost 60% of Central YMCA learners live in the top five most deprived areas of England with two thirds of these learners living in the top two most deprived areas. One third of learners achieving their qualification are located within the two most deprived areas of England.

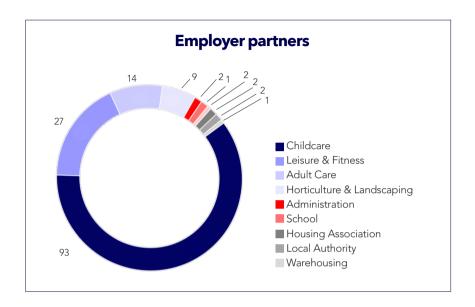
70% of learners aged 16-19 recruited onto Study Programmes in 2021/22 identify as not in education, employment, or training (NEET). In 2021/22, 71% of NEET learners achieved their main qualification.

The Learner Experience

Developing Skills, Knowledge and Behaviours

Apprentices take pride in their work, and are keen to demonstrate their skills and knowledge. This is reflected in the 99% pass rate for our apprentices that complete their apprenticeship.

94%

Enrichment

Alongside a learners' vocational qualification, we embed a diverse enrichment programme, highlighting and providing opportunities where learners can give back to their community.

With confidence in their ability to engage with their community, our learners are involved with food banks and food delivery to those who are in need, volunteer with local libraries and community groups, and help vulnerable neighbours.

Learners also undertake a work placement via our established links with employers. Providing meaningful work experience gives learners insight into the working world, a deeper understanding of future career options, and an understanding of how they can play an active part in their local communities

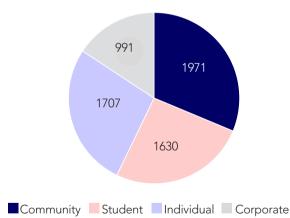

HEALTH & WELLBEING

We're passionate about fostering an ethos of inclusivity and creating a welcoming space for our members across our two central London venues, YMCA Club and YMCA KX.

Our 96,876 square foot Club in the heart of Camden is an iconic anchor of the community. With a fitness and wellbeing community like no other, we have programmes for all people, all bodies, all ages and all levels. We believe in physical health for mental wellbeing, supporting those from 4 years old to 90 years old.

At our heart is our commitment to diversity; creating a safe space for people from all backgrounds and walks of life to thrive. This is reflected in our diverse membership and community programmes. We are something for everyone and will always be a safe space for those who need it.

HEALTH & WELLBEING

Older Adults

Our Club is the home to over 1,000 older adults who come here to improve and maintain good health through fitness and friendship. By offering functional movement classes alongside a range of social events, we are reducing loneliness in the capital by creating opportunities for retired Londoners to meet. We have members who have been with us for 40+ years – we are more than just a gym, we are a community.





Children and **Young people**

Alongside this, it is where eight schools get their physical activity requirements through our curricular PE programme as well as extracurricular swimming and first aid, alongside action-packed Holiday Playschemes and After School Sports. Our vibrant and inclusive programme develops children's physical, emotional and creative skills in a nurturing environment.

Positive Health

Our Club is also a sanctuary for those living with HIV. Our Positive Health programme, devoted to encouraging HIV+ individuals to exercise in a nonclinical setting, is the only exercise referral programme that deals exclusively with people patients who are HIV+ and so is a unique project which we are extremely proud of. This year we helped 178 people, 113 of whom were referred to us this year and an additional 62 who were referred in previous years and have taken out memberships and still regularly attend.

Alongside our passionate staff, 15 volunteers dedicate their time and expertise. These include; qualified fitness instructors, class instructors, qualified therapists, workshop facilitators and a swim coach.

Some of our volunteers have come through the programme themselves, with one offering Peer Mentoring Service. This includes one-to-one support for any issues living with HIV, alongside monthly 'Positive Talking' drop-in sessions.



"At the YMCA Club I never felt stigmatised, and I'm open with my condition. The Positive Health programme is pioneer and helps people living with HIV to overcome the fear of the stigma. The programme has helped me to revert some of the changes to my body-shape caused by the medication and meeting people from different backgrounds and histories enriches our lives. YMCA has also helped me to recover from breast cancer. I was very weak physically after all the treatment and I joined the older adults programme even though I was in my 40's and I managed to recover all my strength through tailored exercises."

Virginia is a long-term HIV survivor, having been diagnosed 24 years ago, and has been a member of Central YMCA Club for over 17 years.
